



History



In November 1950, when the United Nations Forces were grappling in a last ditch holding battle with numerically superior forces of the Communist, airpower was desperately needed. When the Russian built jets appeared in the skies over the battle, and began to make themselves felt, an urgent call went out for a jet comparable to the Russian built MIG-15. The United States Air Force answered with it's finest.....the combat ready F-86 Sabrejet.

The 4th commanded at that time by Colonel, now Brigadier General George F. Smith, packed its bags and within a month the Sabres were destroying the Red Air Force.

Skeptics, who heard that the F-86 was inferior to the MIG-15, were in doubt as to whether it could actually stand up to the MIG in combat. They were in for the surprise of their lives. On 22 December 1950 the Communists sent their highly touted jets across the Yalu to tangle with the Sabres. When the smoke of battle had cleared, the Reds had lost six MIG-15's, 1 probably destroyed, and two damaged. Losses to the 4th, None. This was the first major jet to jet engagement in history. Outnumbered, even on the first day, the 4th proved its merit as a fighting unit.

In the fall of 1943 a group of volunteers from the Royal Air Force Squadron were transferred to the Army Air Corps to form the 4th Fighter Interceptor Group. These Eagle Squadrons, which had distinguished themselves during the "Battle for Britain," continued their brilliant performance in the skies over Europe. The 4th, flying P-47's and later P-51's, wound up as the top scoring fighter group in the theater with 1016 enemy aircraft destroyed.

The unit was deactivated in November 1945 and again reactivated in September 1946, at Selfridge Air Force Base, Michigan. In March 1947, the unit moved to Andrews Air Force Base, Maryland to fly F-80 Shooting Stars. It was then the first active jet fighter unit on the East coast.

In 1949 the 4th moved to Langley Air Force Base, Virginia, where the Sabrejet was received. An overseas movement came in November 1950, just eight days after the first MIG appeared in Korea.

During the year that the 4th was the only Sabrejet outfit in Korea, it out-fought and out-flew the enemy despite continual increase of MIG's in the "Alley."

Most of the jet aces produced from the Korean Conflict came from the 4th. To mention several, we had Major James A. Jabara, the worlds first jet ace, Major Frederick Blesse, Colonel Royal N. Baker, Lt. Col. George A. Davis, Captain Manuel J. Fernandez Jr., Colonel James K. Johnson, Lt. Col. Vermont Garrison, Captain Lonnie Moore, Captain Ralph Parr and Lt. James F. Low.

On 30 November 1951, thirty-one Sabres spotted 12 TU-2 bombers just south of the Yalu River, escorted both by LA-9 propeller driven fighters and MIG-15 jets. Soon the sky was filled with burning and exploding Communist planes. The Sabres had shot down 8 TUs, damaged 3, and also destroyed 3 of the LA-9s, and ONE MIG without losing a single F-86.

On 13 December 1951, the Wing had their greatest victory against the MIG's. The 4th pilots with 50 Sabrejets, met over 100 MIG's in two blazing aerial battles. The results, 12 Enemy planes completely "clobbered," 1 probable, and 3 damaged.

The Wing, on 4 May 1952, demonstrated the extreme versatility of the Sabrejet by dive-bombing, with half-ton high explosive bombs, the Communist airstrip at Sinuiju and the marshalling yard at Kumi-ri.


The 4th joined forces with aircraft of other wings and other services, on 23 June 1952, to stage the biggest joint operation of the war in the destruction of the North Korean hydro-electric power dams. The results of this raid caused a loss of ninety per cent of the electrical power in the industrial sections of North Korea.

During the first eight days of August 1952, the 4th's pilots destroyed a total of 17 MIG's. In this same period, only one F-86 was lost although several minor battle damages were sustained.

With end of hostilities late in July, 1953, the 4th Fighter Interceptor Wing turned to a program that would insure combat readiness and continued improvement of the unit and personnel.

The total score for the 4th during the Korean conflict, stands at 506 enemy aircraft destroyed, 84 probably destroyed, and 491 damaged. This score is completely lopsided, extremely impressive, and is a fitting tribute to all who worked to make such an achievement possible.





Wing Headquarters



MISSION . . . Wing Headquarters consisting of seven staff sections, is the administrative switch board of mission accomplishment. It is from the dissemination of orders issued from this small building in seven lines of coordination that permits rotation of each man, proper assignment of incoming replacements, makes certain every man is paid, assures that project money is properly utilized, and the source of all supply control. It is from here that all operations are governed, all ground and air safety is consistently supervised and inspections monitored. Personal and government legal assistance is readily at hand, and audits are simultaneously written.




FOURTH FIGHTER-INTERCEPTOR GROUP...

MISSION.....The mission of the Fourth Fighter-Interceptor Group is primarily to uphold the National Policy of the government of the United States and to defend the principals of the United Nations. In this theatre of action the mission is to gain and maintain air superiority over North Korea, provide escort or cover for United Nations air, sea and ground forces and to provide air defense. The Group has destroyed over five hundred of the enemy's planes, probably destroyed more than eighty and damaged more than four hundred enemy aircraft during the combat period.


